The Treaty of Ghent is signed to end the war. It restores the relationship between the combatants to its pre-war state.

British forces attack Washington, D.C., and burn government buildings, including the Capitol and the White House.

President James Madison signs a declaration of war on Great Britain.

American soldiers are killed after a battle at the River Raisin. The phrase “Remember the Raisin” is used by U.S. soldiers to remember the massacre.

A British attempt to capture the city of Baltimore fails when soldiers are unable to take Fort McHenry.

U.S. forces successfully capture and burn the city of York, now known as Toronto.
