

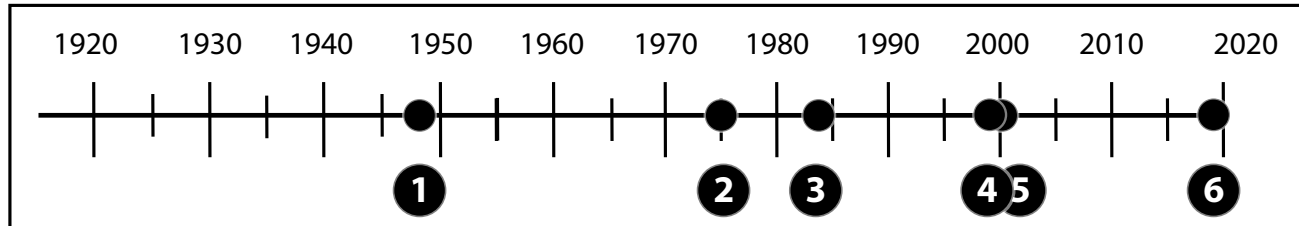

Cheerleading camp sizes almost triple in 15 years. At least 400,000 cheerleaders go to U.S. camps

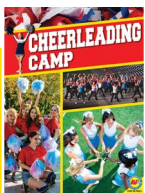
A cheerleader is hurt at a cheer camp. He wins an important court case in Montana. The decision guides many other cases on cheer safety. It leads to extra supervision and medical care for cheerleaders across the country.

Lawrence Herkimer runs the first cheerleading camp. It takes place at Southern Methodist University in Texas. Herkimer had graduated from the college earlier that year. He studied science.

At least 150,000 girls attend U.S. cheer camps each year.

UCA is the largest cheer camp company in the world. It trains more than 180,000 cheerleaders every summer. UCA offers about 3,200 camp sessions each year.

UCA teachers lead a college camp in Memphis, Tennessee. They perform the first cheer routine set to music.

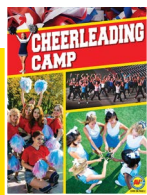

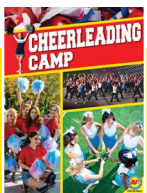

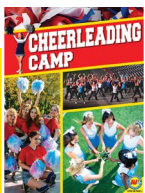
Using information you have read in the book, put the steps showing how to build team unity and individual skill. Write the correct number in the box beside each step. Check your answers with pages 18–19 of the book.

An overnight camp might be too far away. Contact UCA or NCA. Ask if they can create a camp near you. Overnight camp might be too expensive for your team. You can ask your coach to run a day camp at your school.

After you have chosen a camp, you may need to raise money. Money pays for travel and fees. There are many fun options for raising money. Your team can provide a service. Try hosting a car wash and charging money. You can create and sell calendars. You could run a fashion show and take donations for entry.

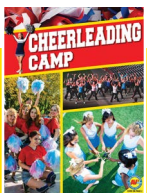

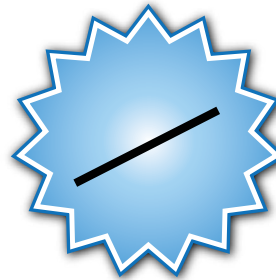

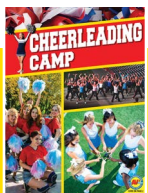
