The first World Series is held between the Boston Americans and the Pittsburgh Pirates. The Americans win the series 5–3.


Jackie Robinson joins the Brooklyn Dodgers as the first African American MLB player. He receives the Rookie of the Year award for his skilled play.


A game called “base-ball” appears in an illustrated book in England. Instead of flat bags, the game uses posts as bases.

A strike by MLB players lasts for 234 games and causes the first canceled World Series since 1904.

The Boston Red Sox defeat the Los Angeles Dodgers 5–1 in Game 5 of the World Series to win their ninth title in franchise history.

Alexander Cartwright’s version of baseball is created, using a harder ball than previous forms of the game. This “New York” game becomes the most popular version of baseball after the Civil War.

- the selection of a player for a stronger team
- shoes with rubber or plastic spikes on the bottom
- hits that are knocked softly into the infield
- the division of a game in which each team has a turn at bat and in the field
- red, fine-grained rock that is often used in the infield
- pitches that fall between the batters' knees or ankles, are swung at unsuccessfully, or are fouled off but not caught
- any part of home plate between the batter's knees and armpits when using a normal batting stance
- throwing one's body, usually feet first, along the ground to try to avoid being tagged out

- when the runner goes back to the bag, and then runs to the next base after the ball is touched by a fielder
- when two base runners are called out on the same play
- a game in which a player hits a ball with a paddle and runs between wickets
- balls batted high into the air
- to run to the next base while the ball is being pitched
- the small hill from which the pitcher pitches the ball
- stopping the runner or batter from advancing
- fielders positioned behind home plate to catch pitches not hit by the batter and to play defensively






