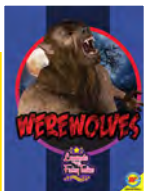

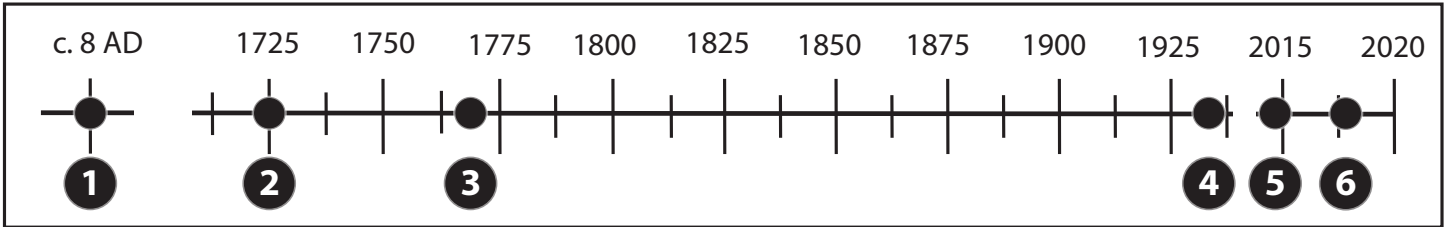
Make a Timeline

People are killed in Gévaudan, in southern France, by an unidentified creature. Today, people believe it may have been an escaped lion or a group of wolves.

Ovid's *Metamorphoses*, a collection of stories relating to transformation, is written. One of the many stories featured in this collection is that of King Lycaon, turned into a wolf by Zeus.

Dr. Jan Dirk Blom, an assistant professor at the University of Groningen, studies accounts of clinical lycanthropy. He finds that there have been 13 recorded cases since 1850.

A boy is found in the German wilderness. Nicknamed Peter the Wild Boy, he was believed by many people to have been either a werewolf or raised by wolves.

The film *The Werewolf of London* is released. It is the first movie to show someone turning into a werewolf because of a bite.

The last episode of the American TV series *Teen Wolf* airs. The series is about a teen-aged boy bitten by a werewolf.

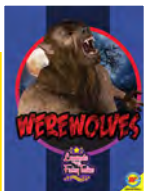
