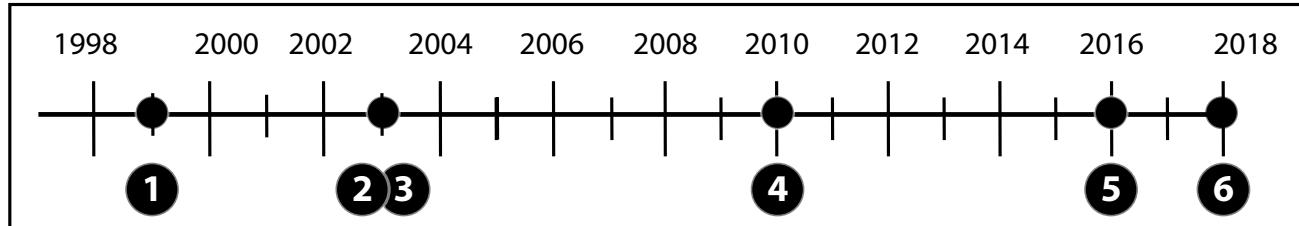

Bear enthusiast Timothy Treadwell is living among the grizzly bears of Alaska with his girlfriend when a bear enters his campsite and attacks. Both Treadwell and his girlfriend die in the attack.

Hawaiian surfer Bethany Hamilton is lying on her surfboard when a shark attacks, biting off her left arm. She goes on to excel in her sport.

When a polar bear attacks a man and his grandson in northern Canada, Hattie Amitnaaq intervenes, only to be fatally mauled herself.

While out cycling in the foothills of Washington's Cascade Mountains, two people realize they are being stalked by a cougar. They are able to scare it away, but it soon returns and grabs one of the cyclists. When the other cyclist begins to run, the cougar attacks that cyclist instead. That cyclist does not survive the encounter.

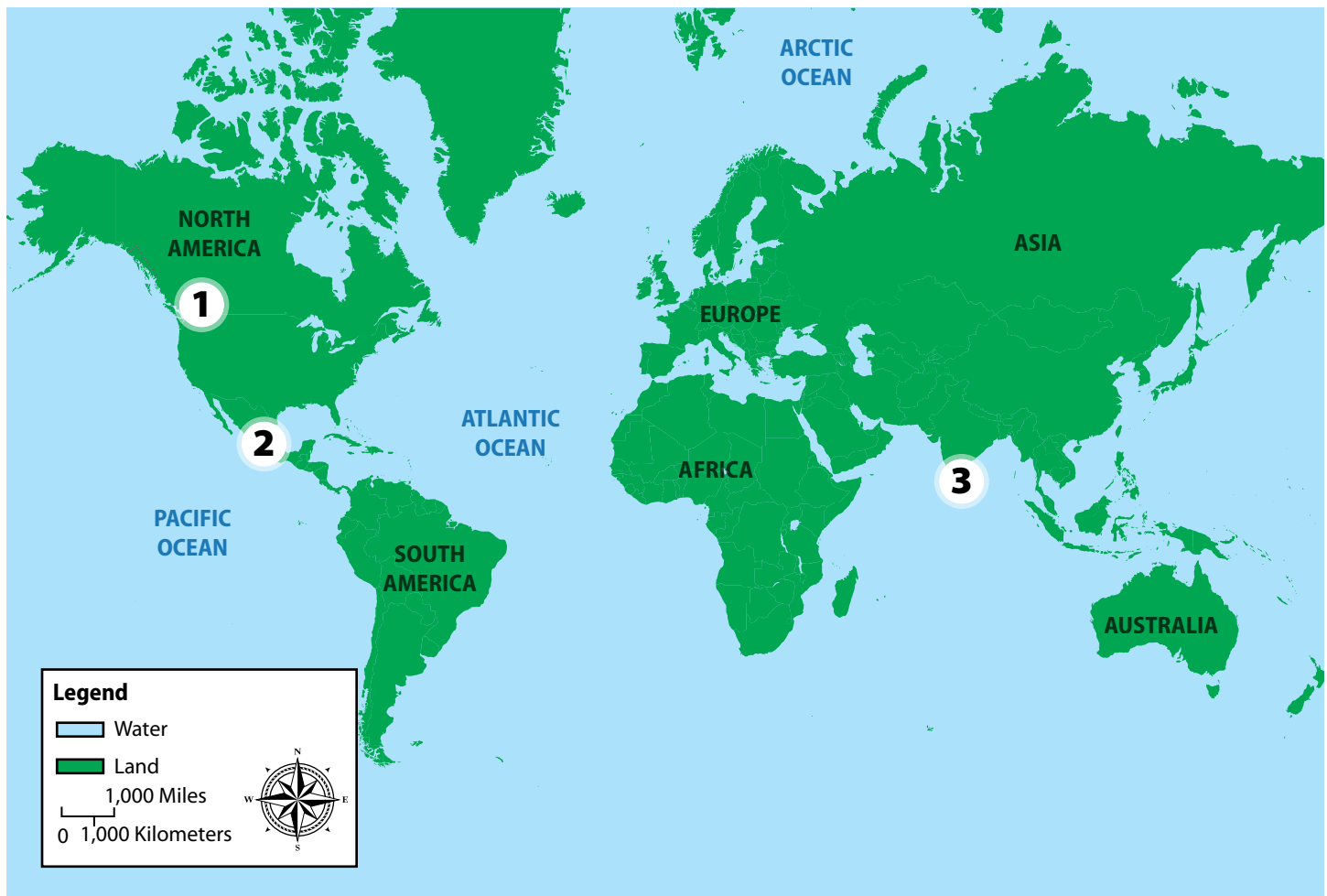

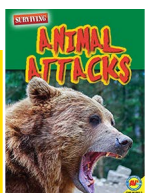
