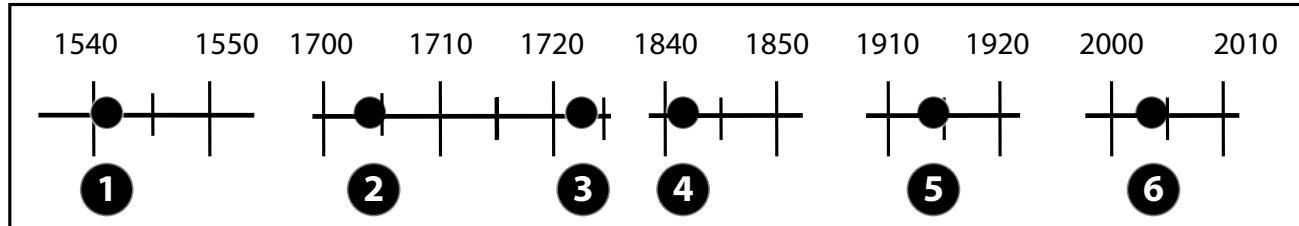


Number the events below in the order they should appear on the timeline. Write the number in the box beside each event. Check your answers with page 20 of the book.



After arguing with his ship's captain, Alexander Selkirk asked to be left on an uninhabited island near Chile. He was rescued four years later.

When the pirates who had captured him went ashore for water, Philip Ashton escaped into the Roatan jungle. He survived there for 16 months before being found by English woodcutters.

A deadly tsunami hit Indonesia on Boxing Day, sweeping many people out to sea. One Indigenous woman, known only by the name Jessy, was able to escape the tsunami's wrath by running inland. She was found 45 days later on the island of Pillopanja, where she had survived on coconut milk and jackfruits.

Banished to a remote Atlantic island for breaking ship rules, Marguerite de la Rocque survived for several years before being rescued.

On an expedition to Antarctica, Ernest Shackleton and his crew became stranded when their ship became stuck in ice. They made their way to nearby Elephant Island, where they set up camp. Shackleton was able to eventually reach a whaling station, where he organized his crew's rescue.

Manjiro Nakahama and three friends were fishing off the coast of Japan when a storm arose. The teenagers were shipwrecked on Tori Shima Island for almost six months before being rescued by a passing American whaling ship.
