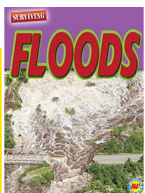

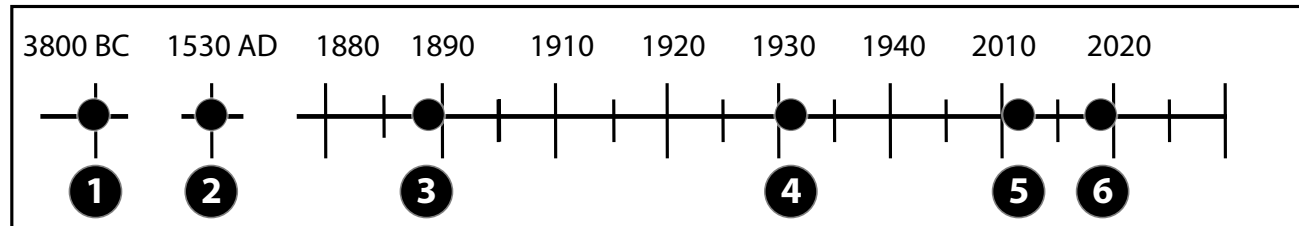

China's Yellow River has been the site of many major floods throughout history. The 1931 flood took place when the river breached its banks due to silt build-up. As many as 4 million people lost their lives as a result of this flood.

Damages were estimated at \$40 billion following a flood in Thailand. Beginning in the northern part of the country in May 2011, the flooding continued moving south through January of 2012. By the end of the disaster, 65 of Thailand's 77 provinces were covered in water.

Kerala, India, had its worst flooding in more than a century in August 2018. Caused by torrential rains, the floods killed almost 500 people and injured thousands of others. More than 1 million people were displaced because of the rising waters.

Egyptians monitored flow rates of the Nile River.

St. Felix's flood completely submerged the Dutch city of Reimerswaal. More than 100,000 people lost their lives.

The result of a dam burst, the Johnstown flood in Pennsylvania released 20 million tons (18 million metric tons) of water on the town. The flood left 2,209 people dead.

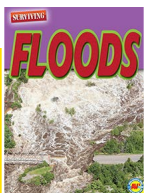

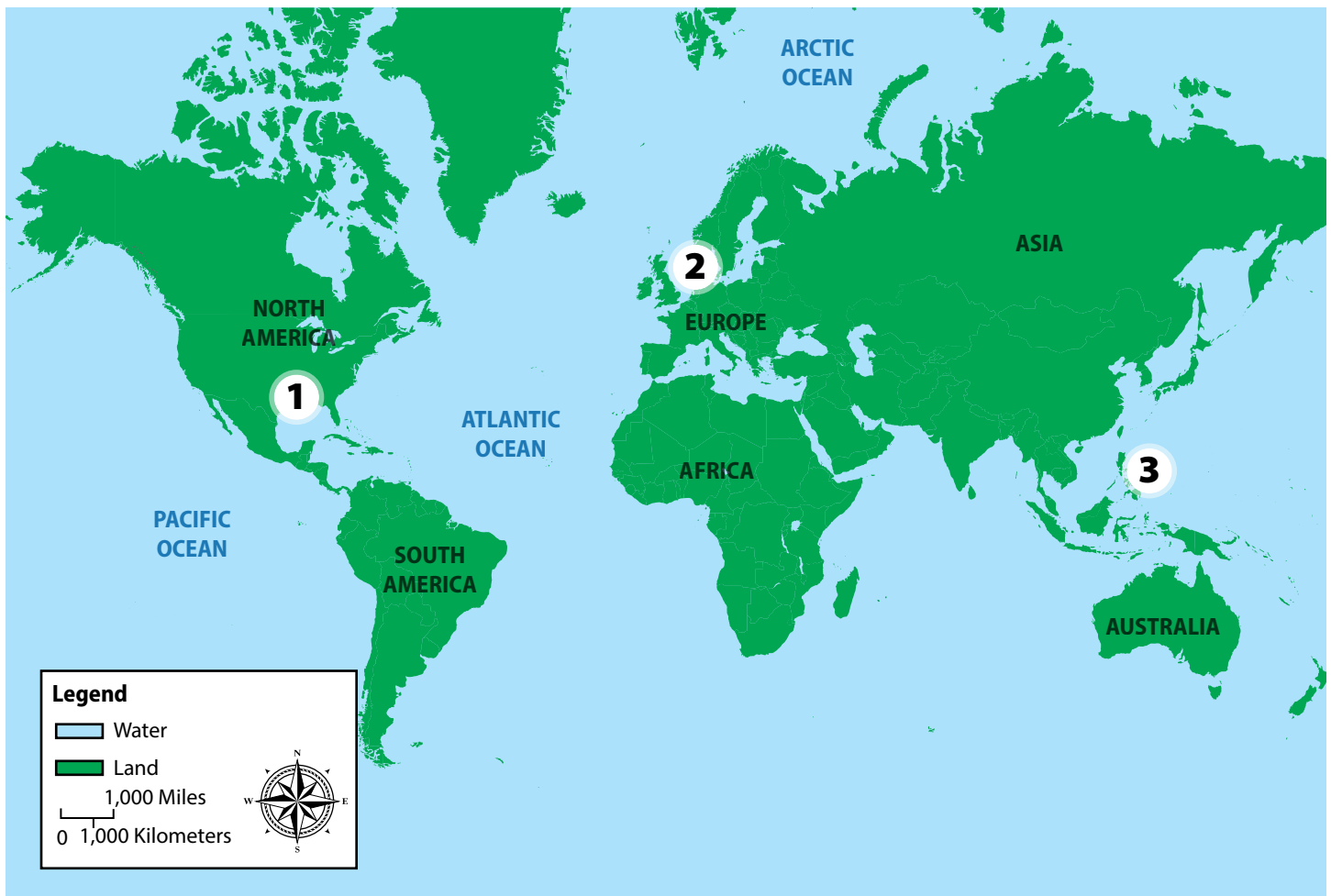

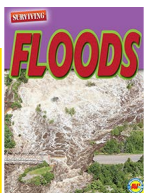
