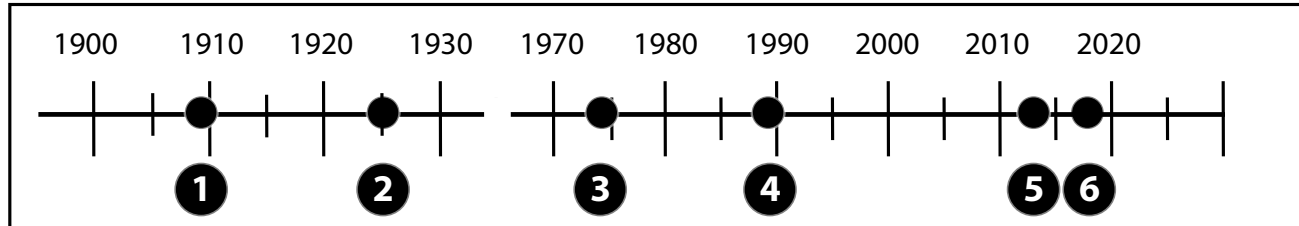


Number the events below in the order they should appear on the timeline. Write the number in the box beside each event. Check your answers with page 13 of the book.



The deadliest tornado ever recorded takes place in Bangladesh on April 26. Carving a path 1 mile (1.6 km) wide and 10 miles (16 km) long, the tornado takes the lives of approximately 1,300 people. An additional 12,000 people are injured.

Thirty-one tornadoes hit Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, and Georgia on January 2. There are more tornadoes reported in the United States on this one day than in the entire month of January 2016.

In Brinkley, Arkansas, 49 people die and hundreds are injured in a tornado on March 8.

The Tri-State Tornado hits Missouri, Illinois, and Indiana on March 18. It is the deadliest tornado in U.S. history, with 695 people losing their lives.

The largest tornado in U.S. history touches down in El Reno, Oklahoma, on May 31. With a record-breaking width of 2.6 miles (4.2 km), it produces winds of almost 300 miles (484 km) per hour. Although running through rural areas, it still causes the deaths of eight people.

A total of 148 tornadoes hit 13 U.S. states between April 3rd and 4th. The path of damage is 2,500 miles (4,000 km). Deaths total 330 people. Another 5,484 are injured.
