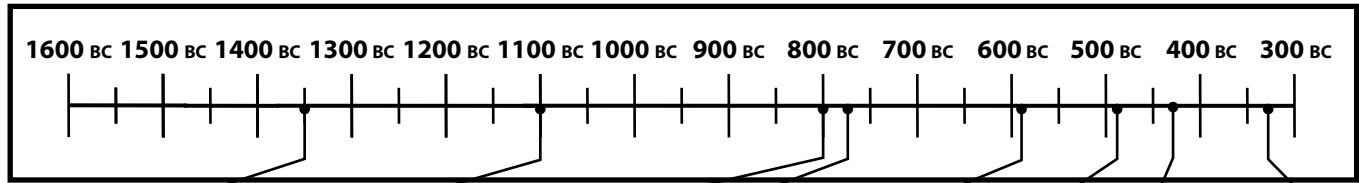

King Philip II of Macedonia defeats the Greeks in the Battle of Chaeronea.

The Persian Wars, a series of battles between the Greeks and the Persian Empire, begin.

The first known Olympic Games are held in Olympia.

Mycenaean civilization collapses, and the Greek Dark Ages begin. The population of Greece decreases significantly during this time.

During the Mycenaean Period, the mainland of Greece sees an era of prosperity.

The number of settlements begins to rise again, and Greece starts its transition to the Archaic Period.

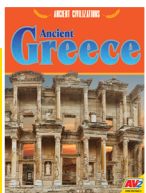

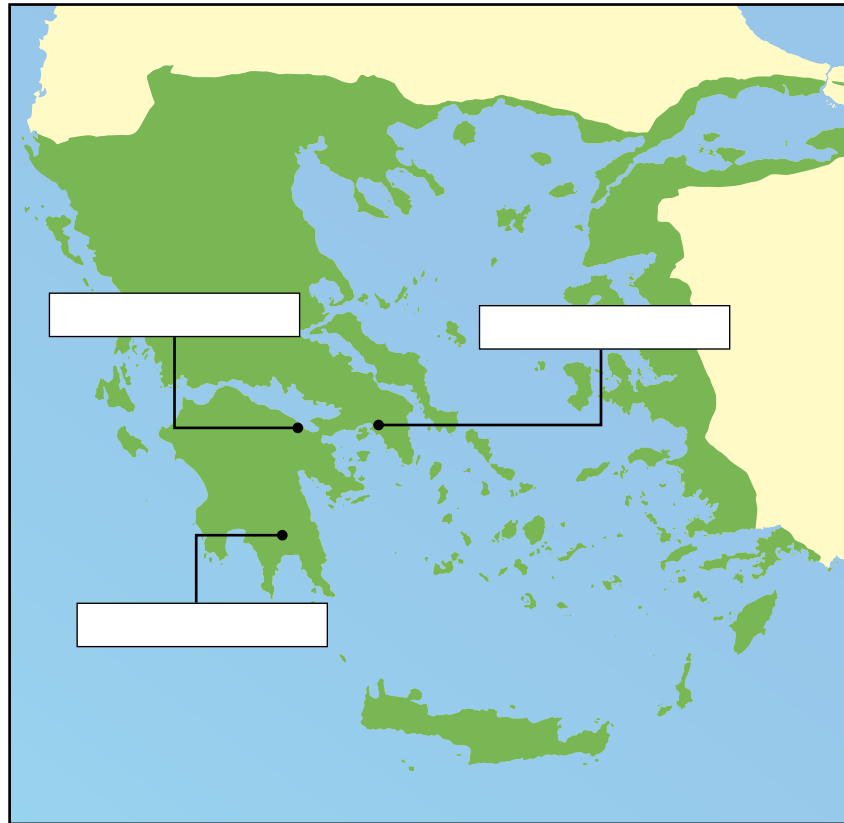

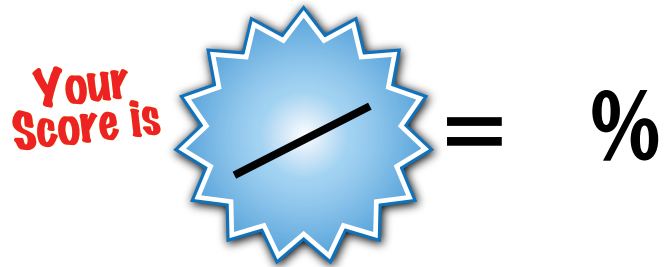
