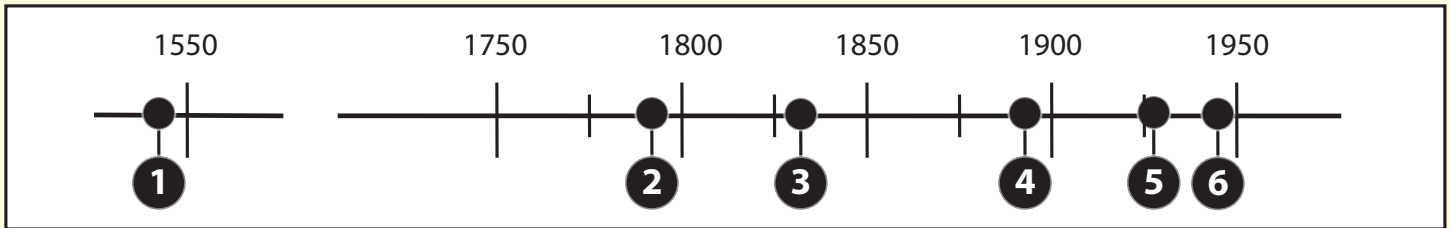

President Andrew Jackson signs the Indian Removal Act, and the U.S. government begins relocating the Cherokee and other Native Americans.

President Franklin Delano Roosevelt officially dedicates Great Smoky Mountains National Park.

President Coolidge signs the bill to establish Great Smoky Mountains National Park.

Spanish explorer Hernando de Soto is the first European to make contact with the Cherokee in the southern Appalachians.

The Mingus and the Hughes families become the Great Smoky Mountains' first settlers, building homes in the Oconaluftee River Valley.

Qualla Boundary, home of the Eastern Cherokee, is founded.
