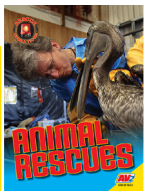

The World Wildlife Fund (WWF) is established. This wildlife conservation group now works in about 100 countries around the world to protect and restore species and their habitats.

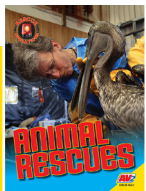
Henry Bergh founds the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (ASPCA) in New York.

Alice Berkner starts the International Bird Rescue organization in San Francisco, California, to rescue and rehabilitate marine birds.

More than 7,000 firefighters battle against wildfires in Australia. Scientists believe the fires killed at least 1 billion wild animals, despite the firefighters' efforts.

Hurricane Katrina hits New Orleans, Louisiana. New Orleanians fleeing the city are forced to leave thousands of pets behind. Over the course of the following weeks, volunteers manage to rescue about 15,000 animals.

The oil tanker Exxon Valdez spills 11 million gallons (42 million liters) of crude oil close to the south coast of Alaska. More than 11,000 Alaskan residents help first responders with cleaning and animal rescue operations.

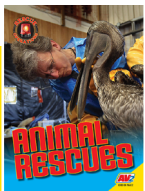

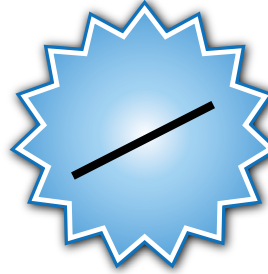

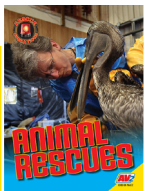
