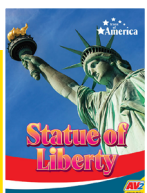

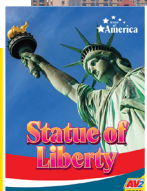

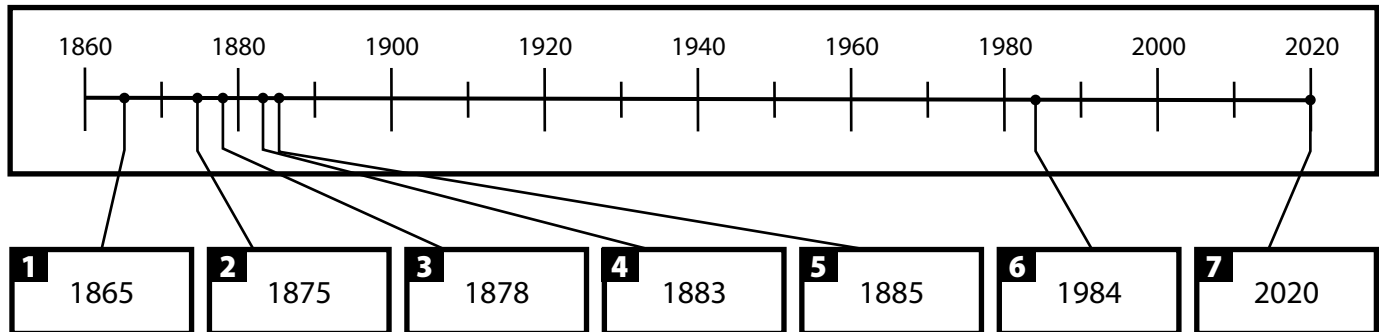

Almost a century after its construction, the statue undergoes a major restoration.

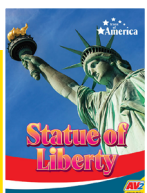
Emma Lazarus writes the poem *The New Colossus*. The poem is donated to an auction organized to raise funds for the construction of the statue's pedestal.

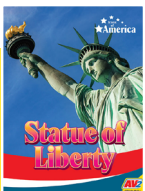

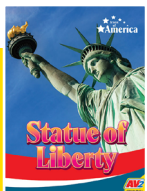

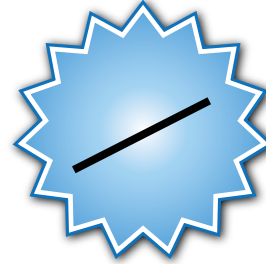
