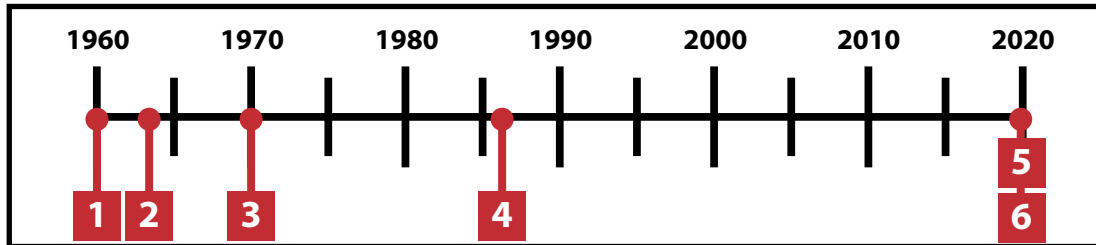

Coach Hank Stram and the Chiefs stun the favored Minnesota Vikings in the Super Bowl with a 24–7 victory.

Defensive tackle Derrick Nnadi pays the adoption fees for every dog at a Missouri shelter when the Chiefs win the Super Bowl. He helps 109 dogs find homes.

After going 12–4 in the 2019 season, the Chiefs reach Super Bowl LIV. They go on to beat the San Francisco 49ers 31–20.

In the AFL's inaugural season, Lamar Hunt's Dallas Texans play home games in the Cotton Bowl Stadium in Dallas, Texas.

Lamar Hunt decides to move the Texans to Kansas City. The Texans rename themselves the "Chiefs."

The Chiefs go 10–6 and make the playoffs for the first time since moving into Arrowhead Stadium in 1972.

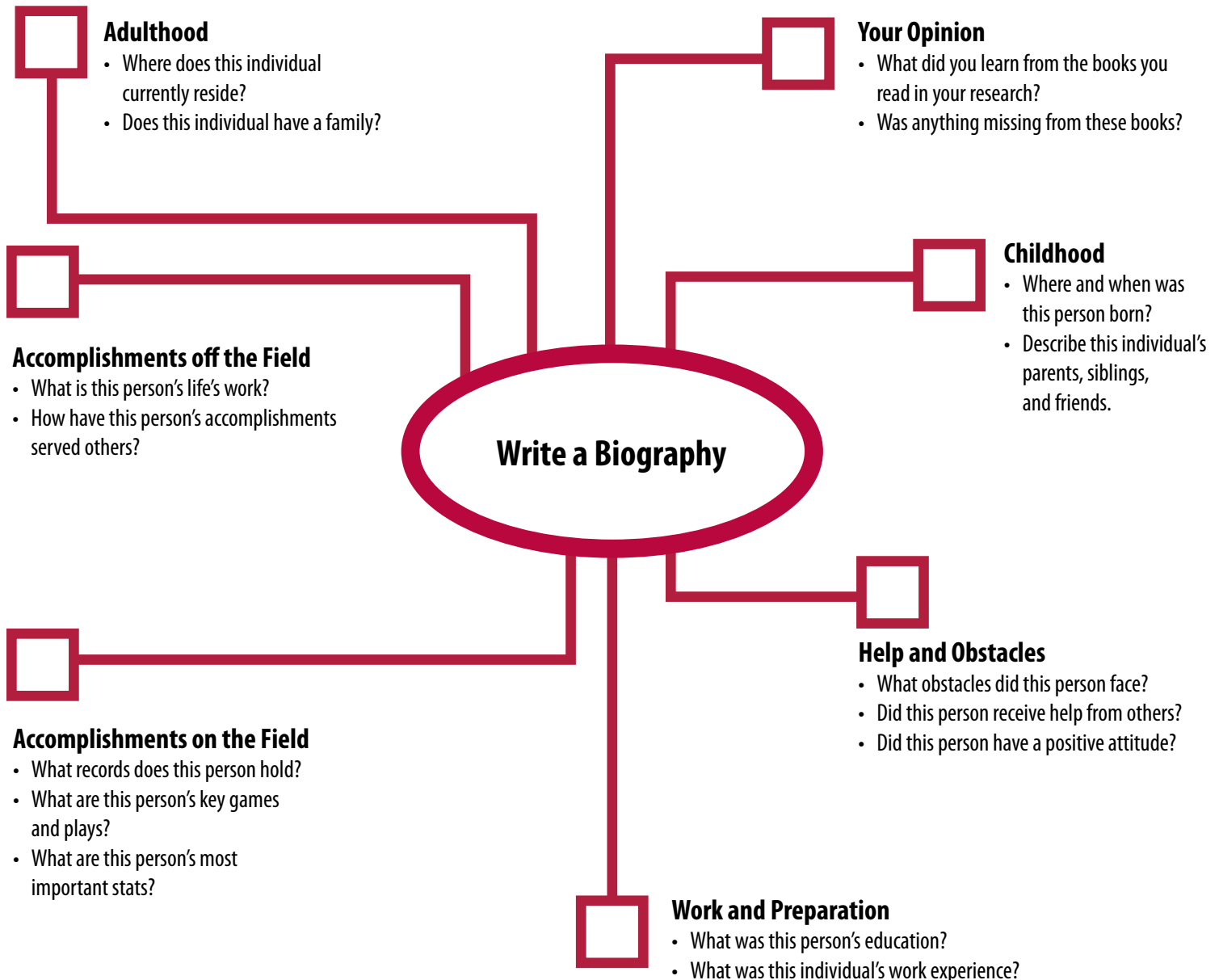

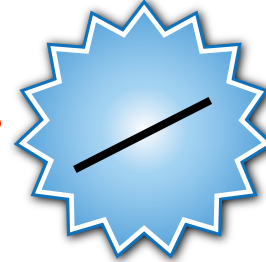

- a rating given to quarterbacks to measure how well they perform on the field
- adding a second tight end to an offensive drive to disrupt the other team's defense
- a uniform that sports teams may wear in games instead of their home or away uniforms
- the NFL's annual championship game between the winning team from the NFC and the winning team from the AFC
