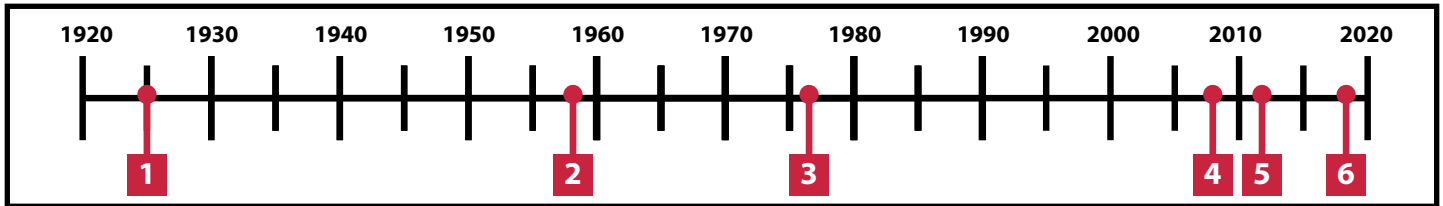

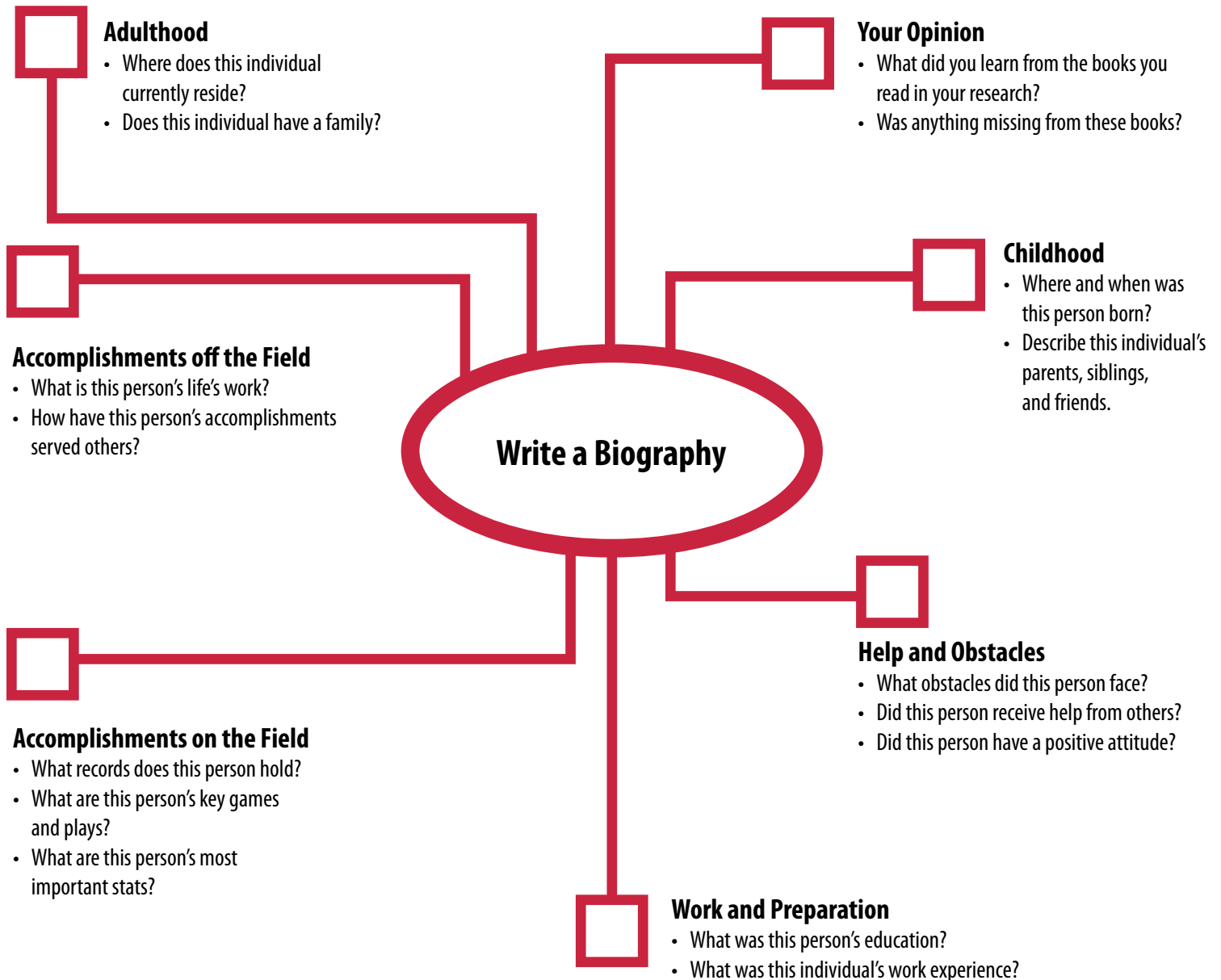

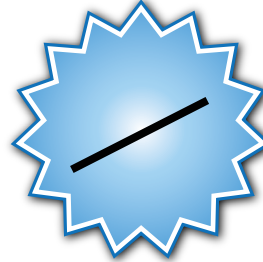

- a defensive formation with three down linemen and four linebackers
- the NFL's annual championship game between the winning team from the NFC and the winning team from the AFC
- an NFL player who takes part in the annual all-star game that pits the best players in the National Football Conference (NFC) against the best players in the American Football Conference (AFC)
- when quarterbacks are tackled behind the line of scrimmage before they can throw a forward pass
- a brand-new team in a sports league, usually an annual event where the NFL chooses college football players to be new team members
- award given to the winner of the Super Bowl each year, named for the NFL Coach Vince Lombardi, whose Green Bay Packers won Super Bowls I and II
- a field for football, marked with regularly spaced parallel lines
- a rating given to quarterbacks that measures how well they perform on the field
- a uniform that sports teams may wear in games instead of their home or away uniform
