- Where did the event take place? This should include the city and stadium.
- When did the event take place? This should include the complete date and, if possible, the time.
- Why is the event important? Explain why this was a key event for the team or player. How did the event impact the team, the players, or the fans?

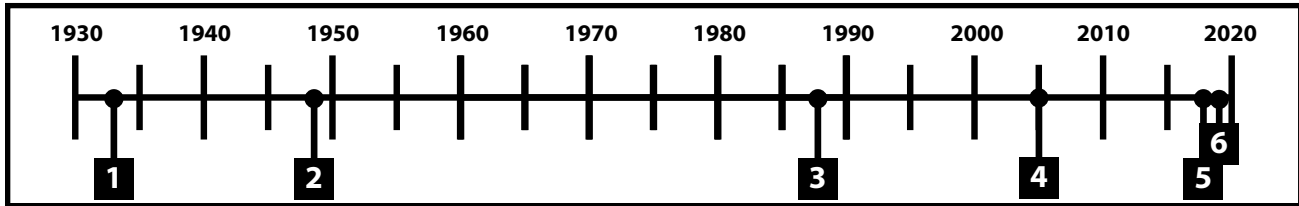

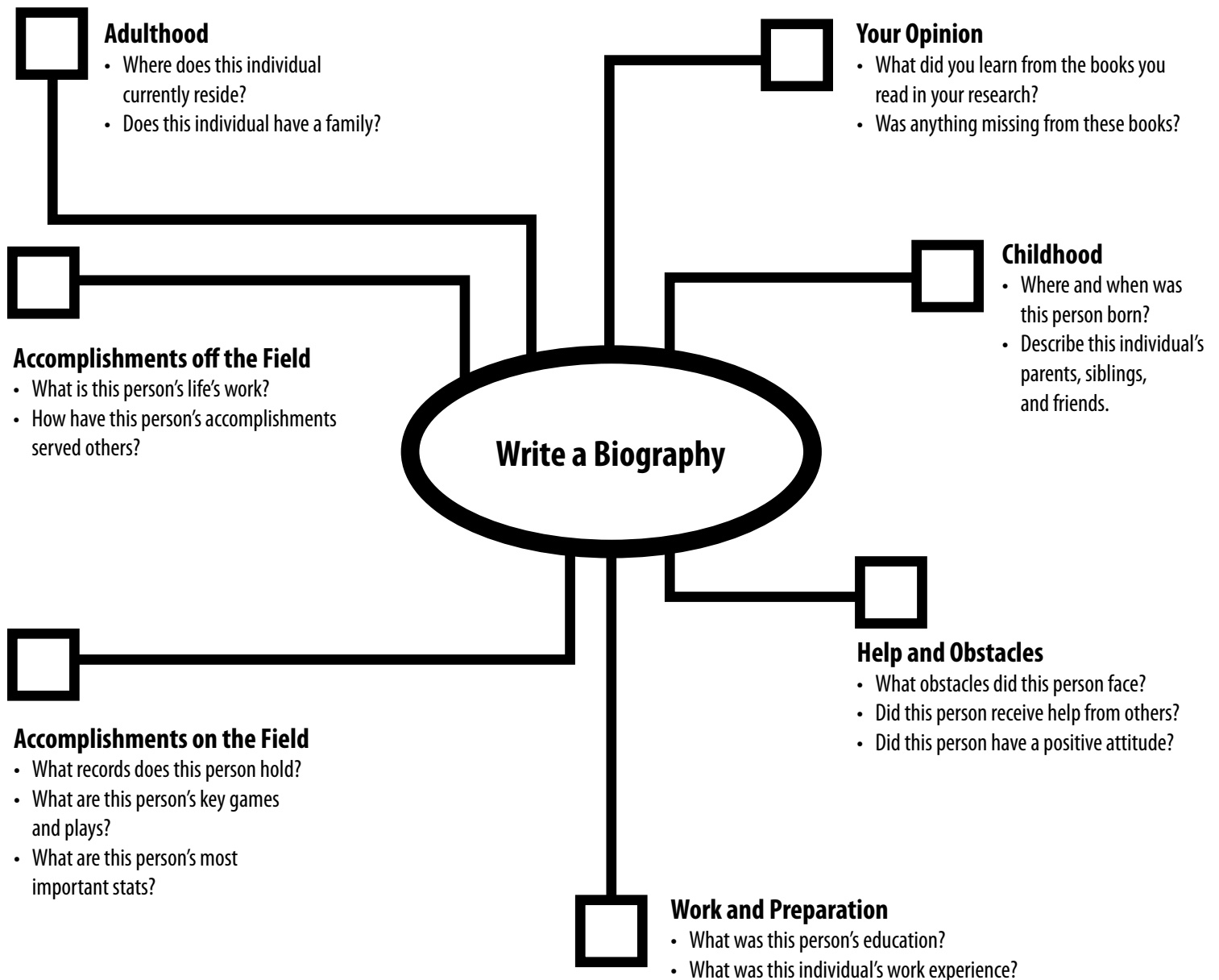

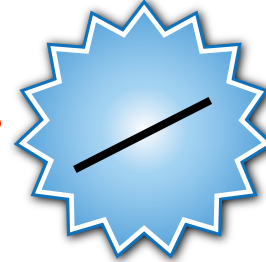

- a uniform that sports teams may wear in games instead of their home or away uniforms
- the NFL's annual championship game between the winning team from the NFC and the winning team from the AFC
- the annual all-star game for NFL players, pitting the best players in the NFC against the best players in the American Football Conference (AFC)
- a symbol that stands for a team or organization
- when quarterbacks are tackled behind the line of scrimmage before they can throw a forward pass
- a group of persons judged to be outstanding, as in a sport or profession
- award given to the winner of the Super Bowl each year, named for NFL Coach Vince Lombardi, whose Green Bay Packers won Super Bowls I and II
- an annual event where the NFL chooses college football players to be new team members
